### **New Business:**

- 1. G. Marzluf moved to approve Resolution 2019-406 transferring funds from the General Fund to the Ohio Public Works Commission Alum Creek Phase 4 Capital Fund in the amount of \$380,477.66. J. Bader seconded, all members voted aye.
- 2. G. Marzluf moved to approve Resolution 2019-407 authorization the Director and the Deputy Director to purchase property in Orange Township. B. Ruhl seconded, all members voted aye.
- 3. The Probate Court has approved, and B. Ruhl moved, to accept the donation of the Bicentennial Barn and a half acre of land from Bob and Sue Postle. J. Bader seconded, all members voted aye.
- 4. G. Marzluf moved to approve the purchase of an F-150 truck for the Operations Department in an amount not to exceed \$27,967.00, and to reduce the price with the trade in of the Department's 2010 F-150 truck. J. Bader seconded, all members voted aye.
- 5. G. Marzluf moved to declare the following as surplus property: a taxidermy Caribou, a replica Stag Moose and a Mammoth Puppet. J. Bader seconded, all members voted aye.

#### Old Business:

1. M. Simpson updated the Board on the progress of the Alum Creek Sewer Easement. Staff requested modifications to bank stabilization materials and provided information on the location and specifications of the future park entrance drive.

This paid time will be in addition to the Director's regular vacation time. Additionally, the Director will have a one-time option to cash out unused vacation time up to 2 weeks for 2019. G.
