



Resolution # 2024 – 578

AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT FOR 2024

WHEREAS, the Preservation Park District of Delaware County (the “District”) depends on reliable vehicles and equipment to meet the operational needs of the District in an effective manner; and

WHEREAS, certain vehicles and equipment have high mileage and have become increasingly costly to maintain and repair and are not reliable in meeting operational needs for law enforcement patrol, park maintenance, and other functions; and

WHEREAS, new vehicles and equipment are required to replace older vehicles and equipment and to meet operational needs due to the expansion of District land and facilities; and

WHEREAS, funds for the purchases listed below are available in the 2024 Capital Budget, which was approved by the Board of Park Commissioners (the “Board”) on December 18, 2023 (Resolution #2023-567) and estimated in the total amount of \$285,500; and

Division of Park Police	Police Vehicle (+ upfitting)	\$70,000
Park Operations	Zero Turn Mowers (4)	\$75,500
Park Operations	½ Ton Pickup Truck	\$50,000
Park Operations	¾ Ton Pickup Truck	\$72,000
Park Operations	Trailer	\$8,000
Park Operations	Snowplow	\$10,000

WHEREAS, certain vehicles and equipment scheduled for replacement were declared surplus through Resolution #2024-571 (approved January 26, 2024) and depending on the value, the vehicle or equipment may be traded in or sold at public auction, internet auction, sealed bid, or private sale, or other means to offset the cost of the new vehicles and equipment, in accordance with ORC 307.12 and as stated in the District’s Surplus Property Policy (#10.13); and

WHEREAS, the Board has authorized the staff to use a variety of cooperative purchasing consortiums and/or through the solicitation of competitive bids or quotes for vehicles and equipment in accordance with the District’s Purchasing Manual, and

WHEREAS, consistent with the Districts’ bylaws and Purchasing Policy, expenditures exceeding \$20,000 with any single vendor requires authorization of the Board,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved, that the Board hereby authorizes the Executive Director to purchase vehicles and equipment listed herein through cooperative purchasing programs and/or through the solicitation of competitive bids or quotes, whichever method provides the best benefit to the District.



Resolution # 2024-579

AUTHORIZATION TO EXECUTE THE UPDATED DELAWARE COUNTY, OHIO, MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT

WHEREAS, the Preservation Park District of Delaware County (the "District") may enter into contracts for the purpose of obtaining police protection, or additional police protection, and for the purpose of obtaining additional police through mutual aid agreements pursuant to Sections 311.07, 505.43, 737.04, 1545.131, and 1713.50 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, numerous political subdivisions in Delaware County, including the District, currently provide reciprocal police services across jurisdictional lines to enhance the capabilities of law enforcement for the protection of citizens, and property throughout Delaware County; and

WHEREAS, updates to the Delaware County Mutual Aid Agreement includes additional members and an extended agreement period through December 31, 2026, which requires authorization by the Board of Park Commissioners,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Board of Park Commissioners hereby authorizes the Executive Director, Chief Officer, and District Legal Counsel to execute the updated Delaware County, Ohio Mutual Aid Agreement for Law Enforcement and to renew subsequent mutual aid agreements pending no significant changes.



Resolution # 2024 – 580

AUTHORIZATION TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT WITH IRONSITE, INC. FOR STREAMBANK STABILIZATION AT McCAMMON CREEK PARK

WHEREAS, the Preservation Park District of Delaware County (the “District”) completed a stream restoration project at McCammon Creek Park in 2021, which successfully restored native habitat and eroded banks throughout the stream corridor; however four small sections of the stream requires additional stabilization, and

WHEREAS, the stabilization of this section of stream bank was approved in the 2024 budget in an estimated amount of \$30,000, and

WHEREAS, the District solicited four quotes in accordance with District Purchasing Policy, with two quotes received, and Ironsite, Inc. was deemed to provide the lowest and best quote in the amount of \$27,526.65, and

WHEREAS, consistent with the District’s bylaws and Purchasing Policy, expenditures exceeding \$20,000 with any single vendor requires authorization of the Board of Park Commissioners,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Board of Park Commissioners hereby authorizes the Executive Director to enter into a contract with Ironsite Inc. in the amount of \$27,526.65, plus any reasonable changes deemed necessary for the satisfactory completion of the project.
