Guest Presentation: Preservation Parks Foundation – Joe Pemberton, Vice-President of the Foundation reported on the 50th Anniversary Foundation Gala held on June 27, 2024. The Gala raised approximately \$50,000 in net funds to benefit the programs and projects of the Park District. Mr. Pemberton shared that the Foundation board is very thankful to the Commissioners for the opportunity and their support.

Park Updates:

- 1. R. Niccum announced that the District's annual Volunteer Recognition Dinner will be on Sunday, September 29th at 5:45pm at Shale Hollow Park. Invitations went out July 15.
- 2. R Niccum shared that the second summer concert will be held on July 18 at 7:00 p.m. at Gallant Woods Park and will feature the Delaware County Community Band.

Department Reports:

Adventure Naturalist B. Nithyananda reported that Outdoor Connections had a busy June that included a 50th Anniversary celebration at Deer Haven Park featuring a hike on the new primitive trail and demonstration by the Columbus Flyers Disc Golf; the Antique Tractor Show featuring 20 tractors (324 visitor attended); Try It Electric Bikes in partnership with Jeff's Bicycle Repair; Golden Marathon hikes in partnership with SourcePoint; and the Artists Series in partnership with Ohio Nature Education.

Administrative Manager T. Swartzlander reported on the onboarding progress for the new PowerDMS policy management and timekeeping/payroll platform.

Human Resources Manager T. Benishek shared that seasonal staff have worked a total of 5,385 hours so far in 2024 and discussed the benefits of the new PowerDMS payroll software.

Sgt. Watkins reported that Sr. Officer Kuhn was awarded a Letter of Commendation for his outstanding professional response to a visitor's medical emergency at Blues Creek Park, providing aid and support that allowed for quick transportation to the hospital. Sgt. Elkins completed Supervisor Liability Training and Sr. Officer Kuhn and Safety Relations staff R. Schneider and K. Plymale attended Cops & Kids Day in Westerville.

Marketing Manager B. McCollam reported on the variety of projects completed for the Foundation's 50th Anniversary Gala including programs, display boards, large countywide park map, and signs.

Natural Resources Manager C. Roshon highlighted the work of seasonal employees Z. Swanson, A. Gaedcke, and A. Willis and discussed monthly invasive species management opportunities for volunteers.

Operations Manager K. Pace highlighted the work of seasonal employees R. Kaple, A. Fronduti, T. Atkinson, A. Prenger, J. Wiest, and G. Myers. Operations staff removed poison ivy and laid mulch in the hammocking area at McCammon Creek Park North, made trail improvements at Hickory Woods Park, and replaced fencing at the Hoover Scenic Trail bridge.

Sr. Park Planner M. Simpson reported that Strawser Paving is constructing the McCammon Creek Park North parking area, which is scheduled for completion in early August. The Deer Haven Park parking lot lighting and Hogback Ridge Park Restroom projects will be bid soon.

- 2. B. Ruhl moved to authorize the Executive Director and/or designee to execute all documents related to the purchase of 60 acres of land, more or less, for the purpose of a future park in Delaware County, including a purchase agreement and closing documents, and any and all documents and instruments relating to transactions regarding the acquisition of the property and requisite rights, G. Marzluf seconded, all members voted aye. The motion passed.
